# **How did Ontolog develop?**

## Ontolog inherited an impressive group of participants:

- SRKB project for Shared Reusable Knowledge Bases, which led to projects that developed KIF, KQML, and Common Logic.
- IEEE SUO project for a Standard Upper Ontology, which led to several projects, including SUMO.

#### Peter Yim devoted a considerable amount of time and resources:

- Ontolog Forum and archives with over 1000 subscribers.
- Wiki, workshops, telecons, and related projects and email lists.

## Ontolog Forum will continue for some indefinite period.

# **Coalition of Wikis**

## A single wiki, by itself, does not draw much attention:

- Each note to an email list pops up in each subscriber's mailbox.
- But a wiki requires a conscious decision for each visit.
- An Ontolog wiki is not likely to reach a critical mass that causes its subscribers to visit on a daily basis.

## But there are many groups with related interests:

- Email lists on Al, NLP, cognitive sciences, and applications.
- Conference series on many related subjects.
- Miscellaneous blogs, wikis, etc.

## Can we develop a coalition with these related groups?

- Each group would control its own wiki.
- All wikis would have "What's New?" pages with pointers to related discussions and topics in other wikis.
- Subscribers to one wiki could also contribute to the others.
